ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for admission to a program leading to a diploma of vocational studies (DEP), you must meet one of the following criteria:

- You hold a high school diploma or recognized equivalent (e.g.: attestation of equivalence of secondary studies) or a higher education diploma, OR;
- You will be at least 16 years old on September 30 of the school year during which you will begin
 your studies and you have earned the Secondary IV units in language of instruction, second
 language and mathematics in a program of study established by the Minister or completed studies
 recognized as equivalent, OR;
- You will be at least 18 years old when you begin your studies and possess the working
 prerequisites, namely passing the general development test as well as the specific prerequisites,
 or completed studies recognized as equivalent, OR;
- You have earned the Secondary III units in language of instruction, second language and
 mathematics in the program of study established by the Minister and will pursue your general
 education simultaneously with your professional education to earn the Secondary IV units you are
 missing in language of instruction, second language and mathematics in the program of study
 established by the Minister.

CAREER POSSIBILITIES

Computer graphics designers can work alone or in collaboration with other computer graphics designers, artistic directors, graphic designers, project managers, marketing department personnel, editors, multimedia integrators, printers, etc. Their work environment is highly computerized. Computer graphics designers use computers, specialized software and utilities, graphics tablets, data storage, scanners, imagesetters, etc.
