Developing Social Skills

The social development of campers is nurtured through interactive activities that emphasize teamwork and includes sportsmanship, adaptability, self-control, and cooperation.

Communication between campers and with counselors is vital to the successful development of interpersonal skills.

Within the various group activities, counselors seek out leadership opportunities for each individual camper, which will build confidence, foster responsibility and initiative, and reinforce particular strengths while setting positive examples for other campers.

Campers must participate in all activities.

Developing Physical Skills

The physical development of campers is nurtured by providing campers with consistent opportunities to participate in athletic and life skills.

Each child is supported in his/her effort to enhance skills, such as coordination, balance and agility, endurance, creativity, observation, and active listening.

Developing Language Skills

The emphasis is placed on trying new activities, learning by doing, and enjoying the process of discovery.

The language component of our program is adapted to the camper's level and is designed to allow the camper to improve 4 skills (listening, reading, writing, and speaking) in French or English. Campers are encouraged to participate actively in classes and they are expected to prepare oral presentations/skits, write short texts/essays, and do homework to reinforce what they have learned in class.

We only hire highly qualified teachers with experience teaching children using a broad spectrum of communicative activities to stimulate campers.
