The Early Childhood Education program (DEC) is designed to train childcare educators to work with children from 0 to 12 years old. With this training students will enhance their professional expertise in accordance with the Educational Childcare Act and its governing regulations.

During their training, students will learn how to meet a child's basic, psychological, as well as educational needs. They will also learn to establish a partnership with parents and partners in the field to understand the importance of discussing necessary interventions with a child.

The program was designed to allow students to find work soon after graduation.

Do you currently work in a childcare profession, or are you looking to begin or reorient your career in early childhood education? If so, this program's for you.


PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

ADMISSION CRITERIA

Have obtained a Secondary School Diploma (DES) and completed the following courses :

- Language of Instruction from Secondary V
- Second Language from Secondary V
- Mathematics from Secondary IV
- Physical Sciences from Secondary IV
- History from Secondary IV

or

Have obtained a Professional Studies Diploma (DEP) and completed the following courses:

- Language if Instruction from Secondary V
- Second Language from Secondary V
- · Mathematics from Secondary IV

or

Have obtained an equivalent education or an instruction deemed sufficient. Every case will be analysed by the college.

LEVEL

- This program leads to a Diploma of College Studies (DEC).
- Holders of a Diploma of College Studies (DEC) in Early Childhood Education Techniques may continue on to university if they so desire.
- Offered in French or English.

IMMUNIZATION

As part of their internship requirement, students might be asked to prove their basic immunization is up-to-date: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, rubella, mumps and measles. Vaccines against hepatitis B and the flu may also be required. Students must be in good health.

Important note: Students will need to provide proof that they are eligible for their internships. A request for police file verification will be necessary. This request will be made by the College.
